## **TABLE-TOP GAME BOARDS**

DIFFICULTY: EASY PREP LIST 3 VOLUNTEERS 1. Sort all the materials into piles by like items to ensure you have materials needed to complete 4 HOURS project. 2. Measure the surface that the table-top game **MATERIALS** board will be attached to. **PREP** .75"X4X8ft sanded plywood 3. Using the measuring tape and chalk line, board measure a rectangle on the plywood board Paint supplies with matching dimensions to your table-top surface. Sandpaper sheets Primer 4. Fill in your game using exterior paint and painting supplies. 5. When the piece is dry, attach it to the table top surface using the 15/8" deck screws.
